### Headteacher's Introduction

This week has seen some of the hottest temperatures experienced during the school day anywhere in the country. With the health, safety and wellbeing of our students and staff as our priority, schools were advised to close early from Wednesday. We expect everything to return to normal next week, which is particularly important as our Year 10 Mock Examinations continue. A small number of examinations were brought forward earlier today to avoid the hottest conditions.

I would like to thank all parents, carers and families for their patience, understanding and support as we made the difficult decision to alter the school day during this period of extreme weather. Current forecasts indicate that temperatures will return to more normal levels by Monday and, as a result, the school day will operate as usual. Students should return by **8.45am** on Monday morning, particularly our Year 10 students who have English, Options and Humanities mock examinations scheduled. Full school uniform should be worn, although blazers and ties will remain optional while temperatures continue to settle.

I would like to congratulate our Year 7 students for the exemplary attitude they demonstrated throughout their assessments and examinations this week. They were an absolute credit to themselves and to the school in the mature and respectful way they approached every challenge. A small number of assessments have been rescheduled for next week, and parents have already been informed by email, with staff also making students aware of the changes.

Despite the extreme temperatures, there has still been plenty to celebrate across the school. Students have produced some fantastic work in lessons, from cooking delicious pizzas and designing creative hoodies to

representing themselves brilliantly in competitions beyond school, including a large-scale pool tournament. It is always wonderful to see our young people developing their talents both inside and outside the classroom. With the warm weather set to continue over the coming days, I would encourage all families to remind children about staying safe in the heat. Please ensure they drink plenty of water, wear sunscreen where appropriate, seek shade during the hottest parts of the day and avoid spending long periods in direct sunlight. We would also urge all young people to stay away from open water such as lakes, canals, rivers and reservoirs. While these places may appear inviting in hot weather, they can be extremely dangerous, and we want all of our students to enjoy the summer safely.

I would also like to remind everyone about our attendance initiatives that are currently taking place. We want every student to finish the academic year positively and recognise the importance of attending school every day. Many students with attendance above 95%, including those who have maintained 100% attendance, are already on track for a range of rewards and prizes. However, we have widened the opportunities available so that every student has the chance to be involved in our end-of-year attendance drive. With weekly rewards, prize draws, our end-of-year cinema event and the exciting Friday Darts Challenge, there are plenty of opportunities to celebrate excellent attendance and punctuality. Please take a moment to read the posters included in this newsletter for further information. Congratulations to the students who won prizes today by hitting the bullseye in our Friday Darts Challenge!

Finally, I would like to wish everyone a wonderful weekend. Hopefully families will be able to enjoy the warmer weather, with temperatures forecast to become a little more comfortable over the coming days.

## Are you entitled?

### **Could your child receive free school meals from September 2026?**

From September 2026, more children and young people will be able to receive a free meal at school. This is because free school meal eligibility is expanding to include children from households receiving Universal Credit. More families may now be eligible, so we are asking parents and carers to complete an application if they think this could apply to them.

**Eligibility is not automatic – parents and carers of children not currently receiving FSM must apply.**

**Please apply ASAP - Eligibility checking will begin from 1 June 2026. Where a child is found to be eligible, the free meal entitlement will apply from the start of the 2026 to 2027 school year (September 2026)**

### **How to apply**

Applying online should only take a few minutes.

It could save your family money each week and help make sure your child can have a meal in school if they want one.

**Please complete an application if any of these apply to you.**

1. Your household receives Universal Credit
2. Your household receives another qualifying benefit.
3. Your young person is in sixth form or school-based post 16 provision and you think they may be eligible.

You do not need to work out whether your child qualifies. You only need to apply. The eligibility check will do the rest.

# Sparx

### How to log into Sparx to complete homework from home

Weekly homework will be set on the following days and then due on the same day the following week.

- Monday: Sparx Science
- Wednesday: Sparx Maths
- Thursday: Sparx Reader

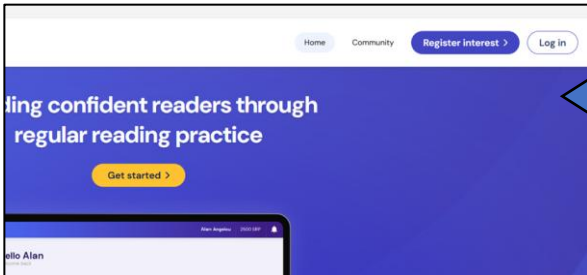
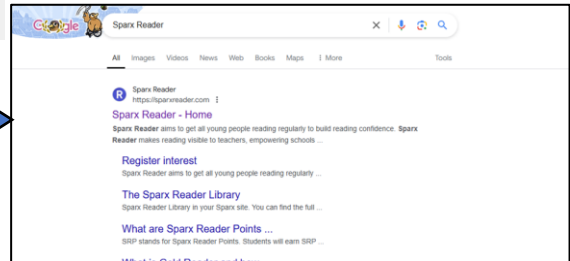


Students can log into Sparx through either [the link on their Arbor page](#) or through a search engine such as Google.

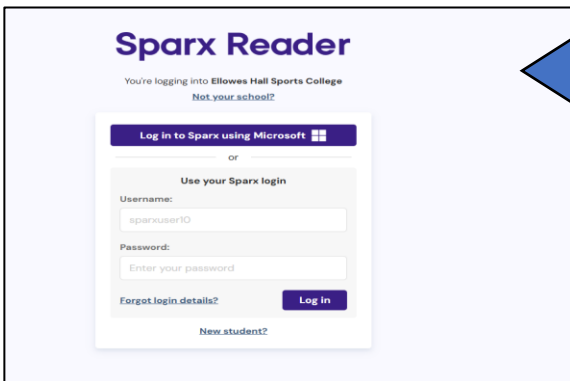
If accessing via Google, students will need to type Sparx Science/ Sparx Maths/ Sparx Reader into Google and select the first search result that appears.



Once they have clicked on either the link on Arbor or the search result on Google they need to click the white log in icon in the top right corner and then select student log in.



They will then be asked to select their school, which will appear as they start typing in Ellowes Hall Sports College



They can then click the purple box that says 'log in to Sparx using Microsoft' and then use their school email and password to log in. Their password is the same password that they use to log into any computer in school.

Any homework students have been set will appear. Students can continue to read on Sparx Reader even after their homework has been completed, and we would encourage them to, especially if they are really enjoying the book they have chosen.
